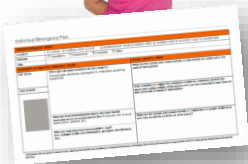

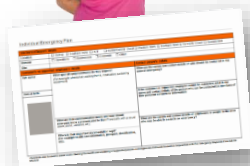

Roads being closed



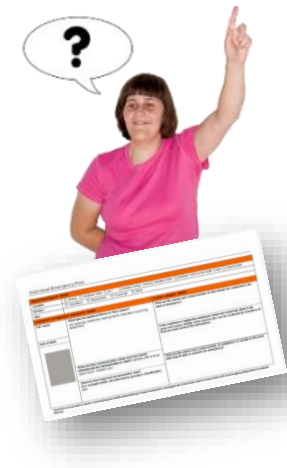

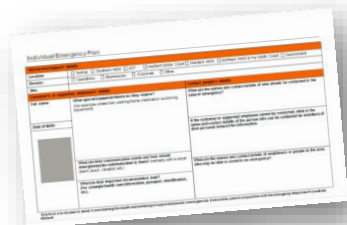

The manager and you. It will not be finished until you are happy with what is in it.



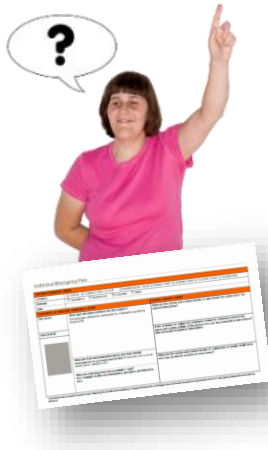
What happens if I find it difficult to say what I think about the Individual Emergency Plan?

What is in an Individual Emergency Plan?



Understand

What help you might need to understand that there is an emergency.



What will be done to keep you safe in an emergency.

For example, keeping extra medication in case the chemists need to close.



How to contact people who can help in an emergency.



What help you might need getting out quickly, in an emergency.



What else is in my Individual Emergency Plan?



A list of extra things which are kept, in case there is an emergency.

For example, batteries, a torch, bottled water, a radio and light bulbs.



How often should the manager check the Individual Emergency Plan with me?



Every year or sooner if something changes.
